Objectives of the Campbell River Christian School

The objectives of the Campbell River Christian School are based on the Christian view of God and the world. It is the specific purpose of our Christian School to provide a program of education which, while upholding a standard of scholastic excellence, has its integrating center in the Triune God and fosters vital Christian living.

The training of children is regarded as the joint responsibility of the home, the church and the school. A definite effort is made to have all three units in a fully integrated program so that Christian faith may be developed. Some specific objectives for our school are:

- 1) To teach that the Lord Jesus Christ is the Son of God who came to earth to die for our sin.
- 2) To teach the necessity of being born again by the spirit of God by receiving the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 3) To teach that growth in Christian life depends upon fellowship with God through Bible reading, prayer and service.
- 4) To teach that the Bible is the only word of God. It is inerrant in all parts and therefore practical and important.
- 5) To teach the application of Biblical principles to every part of daily life.
- 6) To teach Christian character.
- 7) To stress the urgency of world missions.
- 8) To teach the student to get along with non-Christians and with Christians who hold differing views.
- 9) To integrate subjects with the Bible.
- 10) To teach that God is the Creator and Sustainer of the universe and man.
- 11) To teach the student to apply himself to his work and to fulfill his various responsibilities before God and men.
- 12) To teach the student responsible, individual and cooperative work habits.
- 13) To teach the student to think for himself and to stand up for his own personal convictions in the face of pressure.
- 14) To develop the creative skills of the student.
- 15) To develop an appreciation of fine arts.
- 16) To develop effective communication skills of the student.
- 17) To teach the knowledge and skills required for future study or occupational competence.
- 18) To develop desire and discretion in wholesome physical and mental recreation.
- 19) To teach our Canadian heritage and current problems facing our country and the world.
- 20) To show the student his present civic responsibilities.

CHRISTIAN SCHOOL STATEMENT OF FAITH

The basis of the society shall be the Word of God. We believe the Word of God reveals the following:

1. We believe the Bible to be the inspired, inerrant and only infallible authoritative Word of God.
2. There is one and only one living eternal and only God, existent in three Persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, equal in divine perfection, and executing distinct and harmonious offices in the work of redemption and sanctification.
3. Jesus Christ is the Son of God and is truly and eternally God, was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life performing many miracles, died a vicarious and atoning death through His shed blood, bodily rose from the dead, and ascended to the right hand of the Father to one day personally return in power and glory.
4. The Holy Spirit convicts of sin, of righteousness and judgment and dwells in every believer from the moment of conversion to enable the Christian to live a Godly life.
5. Original man was created sinless but because of his disobedience to God separated himself and all mankind from God by Sin.
6. Reconciliation to God or salvation of sinful men is wholly of God's grace through the redemptive death of Jesus Christ.
7. Salvation is a result of a personal faith in Jesus Christ and His redemptive work and is a new birth, a new creation, and is instantaneous.
8. Baptism as practiced in the New Testament church was by immersion into the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit, and it is a command from Jesus Christ.
9. Satan is a person and is the god of this world, man's great tempter, the enemy of God, and is destined to final defeat at the hand of God's Son, Jesus Christ, and to suffer eternal punishment along with those that reject God, in a place prepared for him and his angels.
10. There is a resurrection of both the saved and lost; the saved unto the resurrection of life and the lost unto the resurrection of damnation.
11. Civil government is divine appointment for the interest and good order of society; that magistrates are to be prayed for conscientiously, honoured and obeyed except only in the things opposed to the will of God as revealed in His Word.
