Provincial Scholarships Program The B.C. Excellence Scholarship

Awarded to 55 high school graduates who have demonstrated service and leadership, both at school and in their communities, and who show aptitude for and commitment to their chosen career or area of post-secondary study.

Only one student may be nominated from each school. If you wish to be nominated, please inform Mrs. Mackenzie, Mrs. Scoville, Mr. Peeman or Mr. Bird and submit a copy of your written statement to them by 3:00 pm on Fri. Feb. 2/24. They will meet and make their decision on Mon. Feb. 5/24. All candidates will be informed of their decision on Tues. Feb. 6/24, so the successful candidate will have 9 days to complete the application.

Students selected for this award receive a \$5,000 scholarship voucher from the Ministry of Education and Child Care that they can use to be reimbursed for tuition paid after they are attending a post-secondary institution that is <u>designated by the Province of B.C.</u> (i.e., approved for Canada Student Loans) or a program provider that is <u>approved by SkilledTradesBC</u>.

Students have five years to <u>redeem</u> their B.C. Excellence scholarship vouchers; an expiry date is printed on each voucher and extensions are not possible.

Eligibility requirements

Students selected as conditional recipients of the B.C. Excellence scholarship must meet the following requirements by August 31 of their graduating year to be confirmed as a recipient and receive their scholarship voucher:

- meet core eligibility requirements (Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant) and have that on record with the school at which you registered for Grade 12
 - o Be a B.C. resident
 - Be or have been in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded:
 - Enrolled in a British Columbia public school (including online learning schools), or
 - o Enrolled in a Group 1, 2, or 4 British Columbia Independent School, or
 - Enrolled in a Continuing Education Centre, or
 - o Registered as a homeschooler with an eligible school in British Columbia
 - Complete all graduation requirements, and be on record as having graduated, by August 31 of the scholarship awards year
 - Scholarship awards years operate from September 1 to August 31;
- be eligible for a B.C. Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma);
- fulfill the requirements of the B.C. Graduation Program; and,
- have the following final marks.
 - Minimum "B" average in grades 11 and 12 courses required for graduation
 - Minimum "B" (73% or above) in Language Arts 12
 - Minimum "B" average, no more than one "C+" (67% or above), and no marks lower than "C+" in courses that fulfill graduation requirements for Science 11 or 12, Math 11, and Social Studies 11 or 12

Note: students may apply for both the B.C. Excellence scholarship and the <u>Pathway to Teacher Education scholarship</u> but they can only be awarded one.

How applications are evaluated

NEW as of 2024: an update to the written statement prompt invites applicants to reflect deeply on one reason they are pursuing their post-secondary or career pathway.

- 1. Written statements are assessed by a team of B.C. teachers using the marking quidelines (PDF)
- 2. Approximately 80 candidates are shortlisted
- 3. The resume for those shortlisted candidates are assessed by a different team of B.C. teachers, using the same marking guidelines
- 4. Fifty-five students are selected by consensus as conditional recipients

The marking team does not mark the reference letters but does consider them when scoring resumes

The Pathway to Teacher Education scholarship is awarded to 20 outstanding high school graduates who have demonstrated a commitment to and aptitude for a career in K–12 teaching.

Students selected for this award receive a \$5,000 scholarship voucher from the Ministry of Education and Child Care that they can use to be reimbursed for tuition paid after they are attending an approved teacher education program in the Faculty of Education at a B.C. post-secondary institution. To qualify, the program must lead to eligibility to apply for a B.C. teaching certificate and teach in the K–12 school system in this province.

Students have seven years to <u>redeem</u> their Pathway to Teacher Education scholarship vouchers; an expiry date is printed on each voucher and extensions are not possible.

Key dates

February 15, 2024: online applications due by 2:59 pm PST Early June 2024: conditional recipients and their schools notified by email September 2024: conditional recipients checked against eligibility requirements October 2024: paper scholarship vouchers mailed to confirmed recipients

Eligibility requirements

Students selected as conditional recipients of the Pathway to Teacher Education scholarship must meet the following requirements by August 31 of their graduating year to be confirmed as a recipient and receive their scholarship voucher:

meet core eligibility requirements (Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant) and have that on record with the school at which you registered for Grade 12

Be a B.C. resident

Be or have been in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded:

- Enrolled in a British Columbia public school (including online learning schools), or
- Enrolled in a Group 1, 2, or 4 British Columbia Independent School, or
- Enrolled in a Continuing Education Centre, or
- Registered as a homeschooler with an eligible school in British Columbia

Complete all graduation requirements, and be on record as having graduated, by August 31 of the scholarship awards year

Scholarship awards years operate from September 1 to August 31)

be eligible for a B.C. Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma); fulfill the <u>requirements of the B.C. Graduation Program</u>; and, have the following final marks.

- Minimum "B" average in grades 11 and 12 courses required for graduation
- Minimum "B" (73% or above) in Language Arts 12
- Minimum "B" average, no more than one "C+" (67% or above), and no marks lower than "C+" in courses that fulfill graduation requirements for Science 11 or 12, Math 11, and Social Studies 11 or 12

Note: students may apply for both the Pathway to Teacher Education scholarship and the <u>BC Excellence scholarship</u> but can be awarded only one.
